Discussion Questions:

- 1. What's the relationship between our passage and the previous verses in John 10? How does our passage build on those previous verses?
- 2. Jesus refers to Himself as the "Good Shepherd" in John 10:11-21. Where is His goodness seen in our passage?
- 3. How does the Good Shepherd compare to the hired hands? Who might this refer to?
- 4. Why does Jesus highlight His relationship with the Father throughout our passage?
- 5. Who are the "other" sheep mentioned in vs. 16? Where else do we see God's heart for these "other" sheep emphasized in the Bible?
- 6. According to Jesus, what should mark His sheep?
- 7. How would Jesus later prove that His sacrifice worked?
- 8. Four times Jesus mentions laying down His life in our passage. How does knowing that Jesus laid down His life for His sheep affect the way you view Him?

Application Questions:

- 1. How are you currently practicing unity with the church? How can you grow here? Why is unity in the church so important?
- 2. How are you laying your life down for other believers? How can you grow here?
- 3. Jesus' example of obedience to the Father is seen in vs. 18. How are you following His example in your own life? How can you grow here?
- 4. How can you prepare yourself for opposition from the world related to your commitment to Christ and His word?
- 5. How might you use this passage to share the gospel with an unbeliever?
- 6. How might you pray in response to today's passage?



1-4P Challenge

Find one unsaved person in your relational world and commit to the following:

P - Pray

Pray for this person. Pray for their salvation. Pray for opportunities and boldness to preach the gospel to them. See 1 Timothy 2:1-4; Colossians 4:2-4

P - Plan

Plan how you might engage them. This may include asking them to have coffee or inviting their family over for dinner. This may include inviting this individual to take 8 weeks to study the Bible with you. See Ephesians 5:15-16; Mark 6:7-12

P - Practice

Make sure you are practicing the gospel before them. This simply involves living a Christ-like life before them that validates the message of the gospel. Look for opportunities to serve them, encourage them, and show them kindness. See Colossians 4:5-6; Matthew 5:16

P - Proclaim

Finally, proclaim the gospel to them. This is the goal of evangelism. In fact, there is no evangelism without proclamation. Share with them the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus for sinners, and call them to repent and believe in Jesus for salvation from sin and the eternal wrath of God. See Romans 10:13-15
